



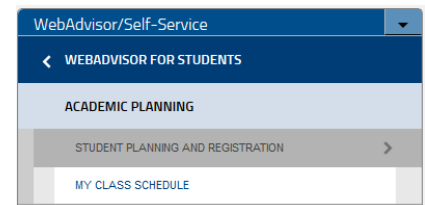
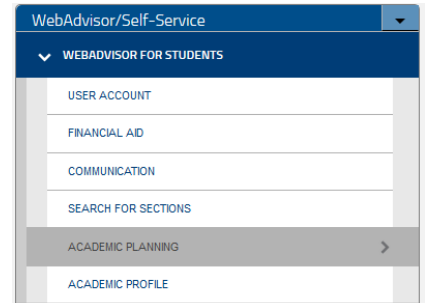

Quick Guide to WebAdvisor Student Planning for Graduate and CCE Students

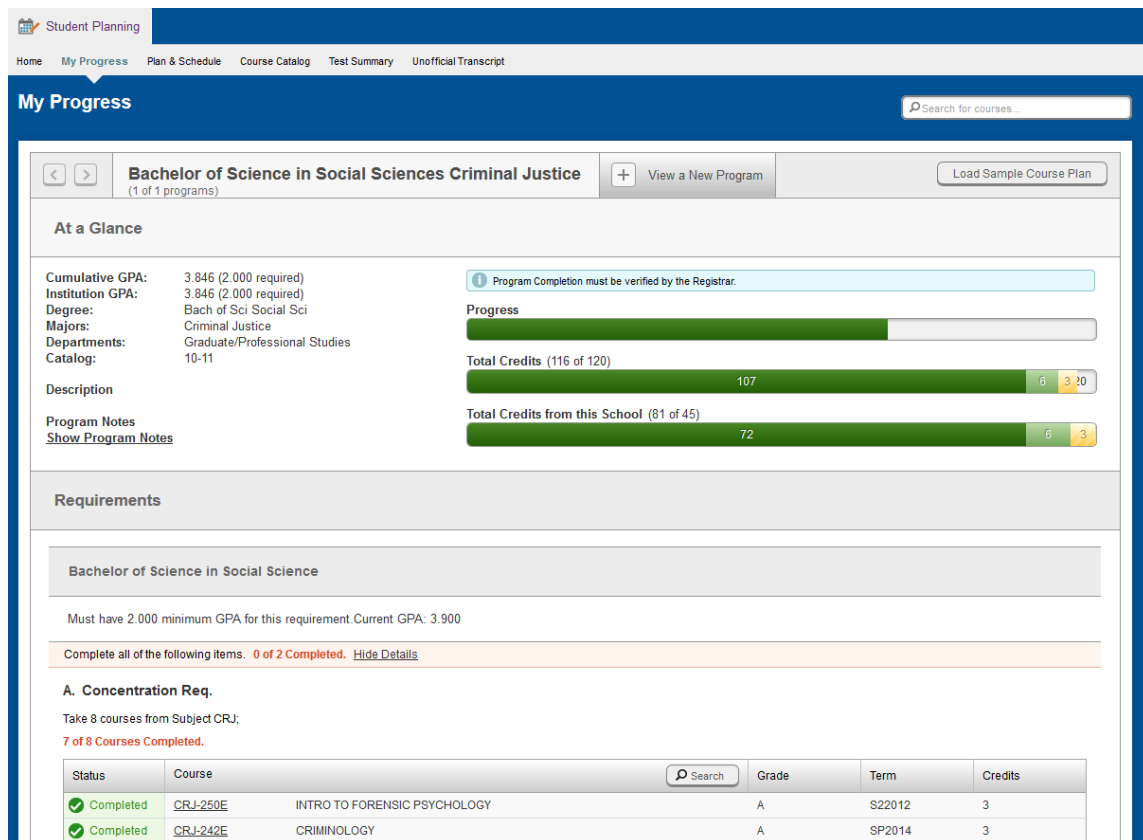
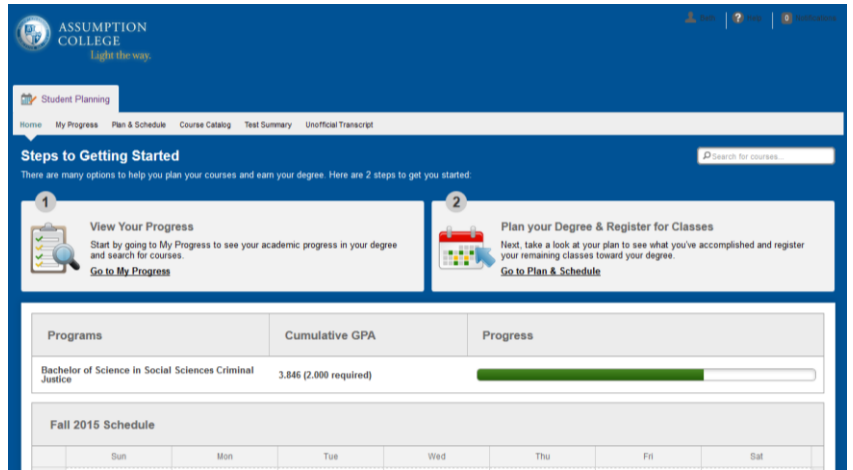

1. Access the portal.
2. On the right, under WebAdvisor/Self-Service, click WebAdvisor for Students
3. Click Academic Planning
4. Then click Student Planning and Registration.
The screen will have two sides: "View Your Progress" and "Plan your Degree & Register for Classes". You can register for classes from either side.



If you start with "View Your Progress" click on "Go to My Progress"

Go to My Progress shows the courses you've already taken, your GPA, and courses needed to complete your program.



Registering for classes from My Progress

Classes that have not been started will show with a status of Not Started in red.

1. Click the course number to open Search for Courses and Course Sections

2. You will see available courses available. You can select **Add Course to Plan** to add this course.

3. From the Course Details screen, use the Term pulldown to select the term for this class and click **Add course to Plan** to save it. *This will add the course to your plan, you can specify a specific section later.*

CRM-243: JUVENILE DELINQUENCY

This course examines the history of "juvenile delinquency" as a societal category and as a social problem. While the main focus is on competing theories of delinquent behavior and the relative effectiveness of various policy responses to juvenile crime, the course will also focus extensively on media portrayals of juvenile criminals and the broader topic of the social construction of the juvenile crime problem. Specific topics include: decriminalization, deinstitutionalization, court diversion, radical nonintervention, community arbitration, and community-based corrections. Gendron/Three credits

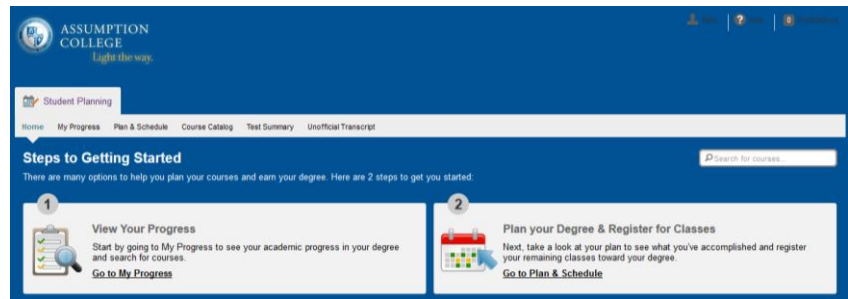
5. Click Add Section to Schedule again from the section details screen.

6. You will see that the course is now "planned" from your My Progress screen.

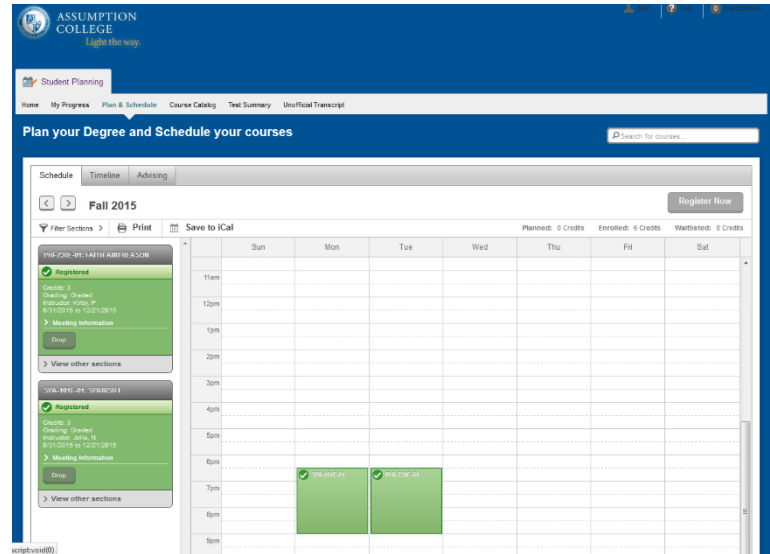

Plan and Schedule

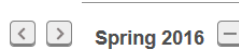
The other option to plan/register for classes is from the **Plan your Degree & Register for Classes** option from the main page or from the Plan & Schedule tab on any page.



The plan and schedule tab shows the courses you are registered for or have planned by semester.



Use the arrows to move to the desired semester.

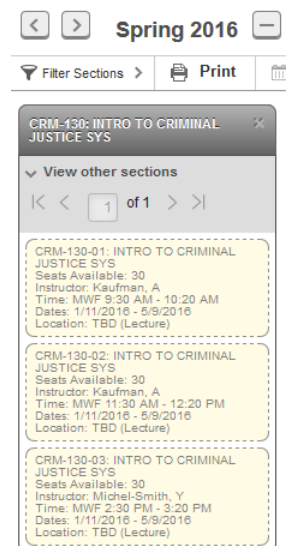


Registering for classes from Plan & Schedule

1. Click **Course Catalog** found above the weekly schedule grid to locate courses. Type in a course subject or scroll through the disciplines to find courses and proceed from #2 in **Registering for classes from My Progress** above.

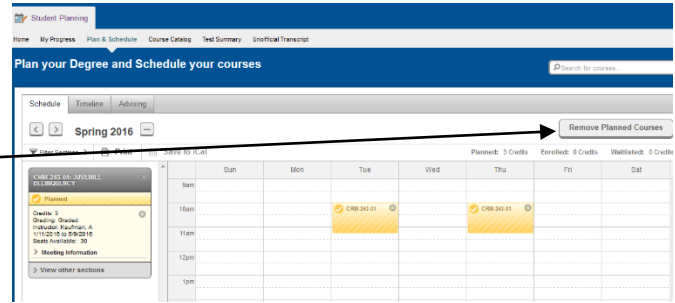
If you have already added a course to your plan, you can select sections to add to your schedule:

1. Click View other sections
2. Select one of the sections
3. Click Add section to schedule



Remove course from schedule:

1. Click **Remove Planned Course**
2. Click Remove to confirm or Cancel



At your designated registration time, go to the portal and access WebAdvisor to register. Click "Plan and Schedule" and advance to the selected term. You can register for courses individually by clicking the "Register" box on the left under each section. Or you can register for ALL courses by clicking the "register now" box in the top right of the screen. Successful registrations appear in green on the calendar and in the listing.
